

FUTURITY DOE PROGRAM (OVERVIEW)

Does are nominated to the MSMGA Doe Futurity by breeders that are members of MSMGA. Does must show in the 2009 Utah State Fair Open Boer Goat Show and will be sold in the Doe Futurity Sale. Does must be registered as a fullblood or percentage Boer goats.

In addition to sale entry fees and commissions, each breeder will pay an additional \$25 nomination fee.

Youth who are 18 years and under as of the sale date are eligible to purchase one or more does. Once registration transfers are completed and ownership is established, youth will be eligible to show in approved shows for the purpose of accumulating points. No points will be awarded for placings in shows before ownership transfers are completed.

Approved shows include:

- 1) All state and county shows (4H, FFA and open)
- 2) Regional and National shows
- 3) Other shows as approved by the MSMGA Board of Directors. Recommendations for others shows will need to be submitted to the BOD at least 10 days prior to the show. No points will be awarded for placings in unapproved shows.

Points will be awarded according to class size:

An additional 2 points will be awarded to Junior Champion and Overall Champion.

An additional 1 point will be awarded to the Reserve Junior Champion and Reserve Overall Champion.

Official placing forms, signed by the Show Manager, must be submitted to MSMGA within 30 days of the conclusion of the show.

Payouts will be made in both fullblood and percentage divisions based on total points accumulated up to and including the 2010 Utah State Fair. All nomination monies plus any additional funds collected will be jackpotted and be paid out accordingly. High point—50%, Reserve—30%, Third Place—20%.

JUNIOR MEMBERSHIP GUIDELINES

Statement of MSMGA Jackpot show Circuit

The MSMGA Jackpot Show Circuit was organized in January 2003 to reward Junior members who are competitively involved in showing meat goats throughout the Mountain States at MSMGA sanctioned jackpot shows.

The MSMGA Jackpot show Circuit is dedicated to assisting individuals and organizations in producing quality jackpot shows with guidelines and rules.

The MSMGA members, junior members, and parents of junior members are all dedicated to spread and promote information about the meat goat industry.

2010 MSMGA Junior Membership Guidelines

MSMGA Junior Membership is open to all youth that are interested in exhibiting meat goats in the Mountain States Region.

Members are to be 18 years of age or younger as of January 1 of the current year. There is no minimum age limit.

All ages will be determined as of January 1 of the current year. Membership will be divided into four (4) age divisions:

- Pre Junior (7 years & younger)
- Junior (8 – 10 years)
- Intermediate (11 – 13 years)
- Senior (14 – 18 years)

Year End Awards

- 1) The MSMGA show year will be from January 1 through December 31.
- 2) All exhibitors have the option to attend any number of shows. Only points earned at the top 5 shows attended by the exhibitor will count towards year end totals. If an exhibitor attends and places at more than five shows in the given year, lowest show points will be dropped and only the top five shows will count for year end totals.
- 3) A MSMGA member may show as many animals as desired at any given show. However, an exhibitor may only accumulate points on a maximum of two (2) goats per class or a maximum of three (3) goats per show. Members may enter more than three (3) goats per show, but can accumulate points on only three (3) goats per show.
- 4) Year end awards will be offered in each of the Showmanship age divisions.

SANCTION SHOW RULES (CONTINUED)

11. It is advised that all shows check for milk teeth and intact males at the time of weigh-in.
12. Show results are due to the MSMGA Junior Point Secretary within two (2) weeks of the conclusion of the show. Show results must contain the all results, awards and numbers in each class. The "Show Results" form is included with the show sanctioning packet.
13. Sanctioned shows who have made a mistake in reporting their results must report any corrections within 60 days after publication on the MSMGA website.
14. MSMGA reserves the right to not sanction an organization's show for the following year if the organization has violated or ignored any of the current years rules and regulations
15. Suggested entry fees for market classes will be \$10.00, with \$1.00 for showmanship classes. However, this is entirely up to each individual show to determine.
16. No sanctioned shows will be for points only.
17. It is suggested that all approved shows offer a minimum of a sixty percent (60%) payback. The suggested pay out is 1st place - 30%; 2nd place - 20%; 3rd place - 10%. Individual shows can determine the pay out percentages.
18. It is highly suggested that shows solicit local donations to help cover show expenses. This is especially important in case of bad weather or in the case of poor attendance.
19. The MSMGA Board reserves the right to refuse sanctioning of any given show.

5) Overall awards that include Market class and showmanship placings will be offered in each of the age divisions. The number of awards will be according to the funds available to the Junior Jackpot Show Circuit from the MSMGA Board of Directors.

In the case of a tie in any age division, the tie will be broken by the exhibitors showmanship points. If there is still a tie, the number of 1st places won followed by number of shows attended will be the final tie breakers. In the showmanship division the number of 1st places won, followed by the number of 2nd places won, and the final tie breaker will be number of shows attended.

Grand Champion will receive 1 point times the total # of market goats in the show

Reserve Grand Champion will receive .5 point times the total# of market goats in the show

JUNIOR JACKPOT RULES

1. All animals must be owned and exhibited by the exhibitor. The only exception shall be -
 - 1) if the exhibitor has more than one animal in a specific class.
 - 2) if the member is in attendance but is physically unable to show his or her goat.
2. All jackpot show goats will be required to have milk teeth in normal positions and no permanent teeth showing at the time of judging. Any goat that has lost one or both of its milk teeth will be disqualified.
3. Goats shall be healthy and free of any visible diseases.
4. Goats will be required to be either disbudded or have the horns tipped. No sharp points will be allowed. No tipping of the horns will be allowed on the show grounds.
5. Wether goats must be castrated prior to arriving on the show grounds.
6. Muzzles will be allowed if necessary. An educational poster must be posted near the pen where these animals are stalled to explain to the general public why muzzles are being used.
7. Goats should be shorn uniformly three-eighths inch (3/8") or less above the knees and the hocks.
8. No painting, powdering, or artificial color will be allowed.
9. Exhibitors will be allowed to use halters or collars in the show ring.
10. The goat that is used for the showmanship class must be entered in a market class.
11. Animals that endanger exhibitor(s) will be removed from the show.
12. Market shows are open to both wethers and does. However, if a breeding class is offered as part of the jackpot show, does may be shown either in the breeding class or the market class, but not both!



13. A MSMGA member may accumulate points on a maximum of two (2) goats per class or a maximum of three (3) goats per show. Members may enter more than three (3) goats per show, but can accumulate points on only three (3) goats per show.
14. No unethical treatment or handling of the goats will be tolerated.

SANCTION SHOW RULES

1. All sanctioned shows must have a completed show application approved a minimum of forty-five (45) days before the show.
2. All applications will be considered on a first come, first served basis. Show dates will be reserved when MSMGA receives the application. Flyers and advertisements cannot be made or published until MSMGA gives notification they are sanctioning the show. Having a sanctioned show the previous show year does not reserve the date for the next year.
3. No show will be approved on the same date if there already exists another sanctioned show within a one hundred (100) mile driving distance.
4. MSMGA will notify the show officials of sanctioning approval within seven (7) days of receipt of the application.
5. All approved sanctioned shows will allow MSMGA to set up a booth at no additional charge to MSMGA. The booth will be used to display a banner, accept membership applications, distribute literature, sell MSMGA related merchandise without paying a commission on receipts.
6. MSMGA sanctioned shows will be open to all MSMGA Junior members.
7. It is the responsibility of the approved shows to send out show information to all paid MSMGA junior members at least thirty (30) days prior to the show.
8. Exhibitor ages will be determined as of January 1st of the current year.
9. MSMGA will not establish general rules for each show. Each show must establish their own set of general rules regarding weight limits, etc. However, MSMGA Jackpot Show Circuit Rules will be adhered to. The general superintendent for the sanctioned show is responsible for making sure the rules are followed and is responsible for conducting the show as such.
10. Showmanship classes should be offered in the following age divisions:

Pre-Junior (7 years & Younger)	Junior (8 - 10 years)
Intermediate (11 - 13 years)	Senior (14 - 18 years)
